 - Please notify Div Coordinator and Commissioner of any games/scrimmages between teams that are not at a regular practice/game schedule or field





Lightning

- "If you can see it, flee it. If you can hear it, clear it"
- Wait 30 mins after last occurrence
- Shelter in building, hard top car
 - NOT under trees
- Have a plan!!
- Check weather radar
- Obey field closures
- Pick a designated weather observer

 - No heading for 12U and below practice and games
 - 14U limited heading practices: 20/week, games: unlimited
 - 16U and 19U no change
- Field safety
 - Ground conditions, goal anchors, net condition

General Points

- Insurance covers players for playing and coaches for coaching;
 anyone else are not covered for playing
- Concussion: Return to play
 - Signed Participation Release for the player
 - http://www.ayso.org/Assets/For+Volunteers/Coaches/Forms+\$!26+Documents /participation_release_form.pdf
 - Signed by Parent/Guardian AND Licensed health care provider
 - Clearance from Safety Director required before player returns to play
 - Follow 5 step protocol defined by CDC Concussion Awareness training
- No protective headgear allowed

Our pathway begins with our <u>AYSO Playground Soccer</u> program designed to introduce families and children to the physical literacy requirements to play soccer. This program is for our entry level players in the 3-5 Year age range, who will then progress into our **AYSO Core** program. Our AYSO Core program is designed around fun and learning and ran by a tremendous volunteer base who allow our players to play in a low-pressure environment. (Find your local program)

The next step in our Pathway is <u>"Extra"</u> which is a tryout-based program designed for players looking for a more challenging learning and playing environment. In this program the players will play at a higher level in a developmentally appropriate AYSO playing circuit, coached by the top AYSO Coaches with a focus on technical and tactical development.

The final phase in the youth system is the **AYSO United** (Club) program. In United, our top players are exposed to the challenges and competition of club soccer. In this environment the players work with high level coaches and play in USYS (US Club) leagues and compete against other youth club organizations. The United program builds on the foundations of all our AYSO Programs ensuring that the players selected are in the appropriate environment to enhance their skill level and competence in the game of soccer.

- Everyone Plays
 - 3 quarter rule for all (including goalkeepers) players in all age groups.
- Good Sportsmanship Show it and teach it!
 - Try to keep score within 3 goal difference
 - Teams thank referees after game
 - No dissent to referees ZERO TOLERANCE for youth refs
 - Referee Administrator (<u>ref1@ayso498.org</u>)



Coach Tasks

Pre-Season

- Contact your parents/players ASAP after receiving team roster
- Verify player forms are eSigned.
- Player forms must be available at all games, practices, and AYSO activities. Electronic version are OK.

During Season

- Player equipment
 - No jewelry of any kind NO bracelets, neck wear, wrist bands, earrings, ear studs, body piercings
 - Wear SHIN GUARDS covered by socks NO roll downs
- Heat and cold injuries



Coach Tasks

Post Season

- Hand in Equipment Bags; usually at Concession Stand
- Destroy Player Forms; can hand in with Equipment Bag if prefer
- Rate players compared to all players in the age division

Rating	Description	Explanation	
5	Beginning Player	Just starting to acquire the basic skills required to play at age-level.	
4	Developing Player	Has basic ability with the skills presented throughout the season, and the player can use them to a small degree during games.	
3	Mid-level	Player has acquired all of the age appropriate skills, uses them effectively during practice, and frequently during games.	
2	Above Average	Player has acquired all of the age appropriate skills, uses them consistently both in practice and in games. than most other players.	
1	Game Changer	Player has mastered all of the age appropriate skills, uses them consistently in practice and games without prompting.

Pairs Passing



Organization:

Pair up the players and practice passing the ball across a 10 x 10 grid. Each player must be on their toes throughout the practice. The receiving player must first cushion the ball and then pass back with the inside of the foot.

Progression:

1. Upon receiving a pass, the players should use the inside or outside of their foot to control the ball to one side, and then return the pass to their partner.





Law Changes

• 05U - 08U No Throw-ins

- -Pass-in
- Dribble-in
- -Opponents must be 2 yards away

10U Build out line

- -All opponents must move (or be moving) beyond the buildout line
 - · Goal keeper ball in hand
 - · Goal kick
- Goal kick or keeper play to teammate on their side of build out line
- -Opponents may cross line when the ball is in play
 - · Crosses the penalty area on a goal kick
 - · Released by the keeper
- -Play must be to teammate on own side of build out line
- -No offside on own side of build out line

12U and Below

- No Keeper Punting
- -Keeper must play the ball from the hand or pass to team
- -Treat as dangerous play (indirect free kick)
- -At spot of punt, or on edge of goal area
- -New Field Sizes

U6 -→ 6U	30y x 15y field; 4'x6' goal	25-35y x 15-25y field; 4'x6' goal
U8 → 8U	50y x 25y field; 6'x18' goal	25-35y x 15-25y field; 4'x6' goal
U10→ 10U	80y x 40y field; 7'x21' goal	55-65y x 35-45y field; 6.5'x18.5' goal
U12 → 12U	100y x 50y field; 8'x24' goal	70-80y x 40-55y field; 7'x21' goal



Law Changes

- Removal of "triple punishment" scenario
 - -DOGSO sanctions: play down + PK + Red Card suspension
 - NEW LAW: "legitimate attempt to play the ball" results in fouls player cautioned (YELLOW) instead of Sent Off (RED)
 - -NOTES:
 - Only applies to fouls inside the penalty area
 - Referee's opinion if "legitimate attempt to play the ball"
 - Foul outside penalty area would be subject to a send off
- Kick-off now kicked in any direction, including backwards
- Players injured in a reckless or excessive force challenge (resulting in caution or send off) NOT required to leave field to receive treatment (expeditious treatment)
- Goalkeeper comes off line during PK is cautioned if the kick fails, and PK re-taken

Law Changes

- Kicker of penalty kick violates Laws, then kick NOT retaken.
 Restart IFK for defending team
- Foul occurs when players are off field (through course of normal play), then restart is appropriate free kick on the touchline or goal line
 - –Old Laws: play restarts dropped ball. Only misconduct committed off the field
 - -New Laws: could result in a penalty kick being awarded
- Offside restarts now taken from the point on the field where the offending player was when they became offside
 - –Old Laws: restart taken from the point where they were originally in an offside position
